

Terrorism Update

The current threat level for the UK is 'SUBSTANTIAL', meaning a terror attack is 'likely'. For further information see <u>GOV.UK.</u>

Bombing Victims Remembered at Permanent Memorial on 5yr Anniversary (Independent 22nd May) 1.

Sunday 22nd May saw the five year anniversary of the Manchester Arena Bombing that killed 22 people and injured 800 after an Arianna Grande concert in 2017. A memorial service was held at the newly opened Glade of Light memorial where the victim's names are carved in bronze on a white marble halo surrounding a garden of remembrance. Posting on twitter, Manchester Mayor, Andy Burnham said,

"Their names forever at the heart of our city...Their families and those affected always in our thoughts...Our thanks for the goodness and strength of the people of Greater Manchester — eternal."

UK's Youngest Terror Offender Walks Free from Court (Independent 21st May)

The UK's Youngest terror offender (who cannot be named for legal reasons) was handed a one-year referral order and walked free from court last week after the judge ruled a custodial sentence would be not be appropriate. The boy was 13 and two months at the time his offences were discovered. The judge remarked he was not at the same intellectual level as other children his age and there was no evidence the boy intended to carry out an attack. A search at the boy's home address revealed neo-Nazi and far-right material, the Anarchist's Cook Book, bomb making manuals and had downloaded an image of Hitler onto his laptop at age eleven. Judge Goldspring told the boy:

"I accept that you perhaps like many young people in these circumstances did not voice your virtual world thoughts in the real world and you do not present in the real world in the same way."

PREVENT Review Calls for Renewed Focus on Islamic Extremism (The National 17th May) 2.

The on-going review of the UK Government's PREVENT programme has called for a 'renewed focus on Islamic extremism' according to 'leaked' documents seen by the Guardian newspaper. Further to the report regarding anti-PREVENT sentiment by Sir John Jenkins and subsequent comments from ex-PM David Cameron (see our Digest 4th May), the leaked documents accuse the Government of a 'double standard' in how they deal with different forms of extremism. It goes on to suggest some PREVENT funded organisations promote 'extremist narratives' and repeated earlier calls from the ex-PM and the Jenkins report to cease the funding of groups who actively seek to subvert it stating:

"As a core principle, the government must cease to engage with or fund those aligned with extremism"

The Islamic focus of the leaked documents was met with criticism from some counter terror experts who say the review does not take into consideration the rise of right-wing extremism and 'amorphous ideology' (such as the recent 'incel' leaning attack in Plymouth in August 2021) and appears to have a historic view of the threat 'circa 2004-2007'.

World news

<u>Iran's Revolutionary Guards Blame 'Global Arrogance' for Death of Khodai (Euronews 23rd May)</u> 3.4.

The assassination of a senior Iranian Revolutionary Guard and member of the elite Quds unit, Colonel Sayyad Khodai prompted promises of revenge from the country's President at the weekend. Ebrahim Raisi declared the killing would be 'avenged' and made it clear Iran lays blame for the attack at the feet of both Israel and the US. Iran's Revolutionary Guards stated Khodai died at the hands of 'global arrogance'. Two suspects on a motorcycle shot the Colonel five times in a drive-by shooting directed at his unarmoured vehicle outside his highly secure home in the capital, Tehran. Little details are known of the attack but State-run media is reporting the arrest of an Israeli intelligence network in-country, although it is not clear if this is related. Gen Qasem Soleimani (Quds' top commander) was assassinated by a US drone Strike in Baghdad in January 2020.

COVID Alert Level Reduced as Omicron Wave Subsides (SKY News 17th May)


The UK's COVID alert level was lowered at the weekend from level four to level three in response to the Omicron wave subsiding and it's variants reclassified as variants of concern. The alert was dropped from classification level four — 'Transmission is high or rising exponentially' to level three 'Virus is in general circulation'. The level has been set by the Joint Bio Security Centre in agreement with the Chief Medical Officers of England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales. COVID Infections across the UK are at their lowest rate in five months.

Albanese will 'do Politics Better' as Australia Votes in New PM (SydneyMorningHerald 23rd May) 5.

Australia voted in it's centre-left Labour Party for the first time in a decade at the weekend as the country took to the polls in a National Election which reflected a positive populous shift towards climate change policies. Anthony Albanese, the 59 year-old new Prime Minister was sworn in on Monday. In his first address to the Australian Nation he said:

"Australians have voted for change. My government intends to implement that change in an orderly way...I want to bring people together and I want to change the way that politics is conducted in this country...I do believe that we can do politics better and I hope to do so."

Labour must secure 76 seats to not require a coalition and 77 seats are needed for a ruling majority, with 74 seats acquired so far (some postal votes are yet to be counted) they are expected to secure the further votes needed.

SECURITY

ICT Secure Suspends 14 Employees Following Arrests (Birmingham Mail 23rd May) 6.

14 ICT Secure security staff have been suspended by company bosses after their arrests for alleged assaults on members of the public at a hospital in London. Officers working at The Croydon University Trust hospital reportedly shared CCTV images of them using 'force' on members of the public and allegations have been made regarding the deletion of further incriminating CCTV evidence. The investigation follows threatened strike action by hospital cleaners at the Trust which was called off only after a 24% pay rise was negotiated with their G4S employers. ICT Secure refused to comment on the on-going investigation and the hospital said it was co-operating with the police and helping with enquiries.


BP and Shell Suffer Brandalism Ahead of Oil Conference in Aberdeen (Press & Journal 22nd May)

Fake Shell and BP advertising billboards have popped up in Aberdeen ahead of the 'Offshore Energy UK' conference at the P&J arena in the city this week. Brandalism UK, who claim to be: 'subvertisers confronting corporate persuasion architectures. Hacking space, place, brands and psyche,' have organised fake advertising billboards for both oil giants across the city in response, to a plethora of greenwashing adverts by Shell and BP appearing all over Aberdeen which they claim to be inaccurate. Both oil giants responded to the campaign encouraging the debate and highlighting the billions of pounds worth of investment they regularly bring to the UK.

TRANSPORT

Vote Closes Wednesday for Largest Rail Strike in Modern History (Sky News 21st May) 7. 8. 10.

RMT members on Network Rail and Chiltern Railways, Cross Country Trains, Greater Anglia, LNER, East Midlands Railway, c2c, Great Western Railway, Northern Trains, South Eastern Railway, South Western Railway, Island Line, GTR (including Gatwick Express), Transpennine Express, Avanti West Coast, and West Midlands Trains voted for strike action this week with 89% of RMT members voting for what is considered to be **the 'largest rail strike in modern history'** and will see disruption across all parts of the UK. Expected to commence as early as June limited services are expected to run from 7am to 7pm only. Scots rail passengers are already seeing almost 700 fewer services per day from Monday this week due to a staff 'work to rule' policy and new staff training delays. Scots rail and Transport Salaried Staffs' Association (TSSA) members have expressed their intent to hold upcoming ballots also. Should the strike go ahead the UK could face major disruption leading to amongst other things, supply chain issues. 4,000 London Underground staff are expected to walk out on Monday 6th June with rumours of further strike action across the Jubilee weekend.

QUEENS JUBILEE WEEKEND 2ND - 5TH JUNE

A SPECIAL EXTENDED BANK HOLIDAY WEEKEND WILL PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMUNITIES AND PEOPLE THROUGHOUT THE UNITED KINGDOM TO COME TOGETHER TO CELEBRATE THE HISTORIC MILESTONE

The Big Jubilee lunch and numerous street parties will take place in villages and cities across the UK between Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th of June in celebration of the Queen's 70th Jubilee.

Over 60,000 groups have registered their intent to stage a party with an expected 10 million people getting involved over the bank holiday weekend.

SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER

(If organising or attending an event)

- Operational plan including a site plan and risk assessment
- Emergency plan, health and safety, legislation and litigation
- Road closures, signage, special effects, etc.
- Fire safety, stewarding, medical provision, toilets
- Disabled access, temporary structures
- Emergency vehicle access, car parking
- Sound / PA Systems, food and drink
- Waste disposal
- Public liability insurance
- Premises licence or a Temporary Event Notice (TEN)
- Others as necessary (depending on type of event)
- ACT Awareness

TRANSPORT

Elizabeth Line Suspended Two Hours After Maiden Voyage (Express 24th May) 11.

Passengers queued around the block, Tuesday morning for the maiden voyage of the newly opened Transport for London Queen Elizabeth line. 300 people queued outside the station prior to the 6:30am departure waiting to travel on its first journey along with London Mayor Sadiq Khan, the Queen had officially opened the line last Tuesday (17th). Passengers faced disruption on the line two hours after officially opening when a fire alarm was triggered in error at Paddington station causing an evacuation and the suspension of the Elizabeth line between Paddington and Tottenham Court Road. The station evacuation took eight minutes and services had resumed within 30 minutes.

NATIONAL EVENTS

The Queen attends Chelsea Flower Show 2022 (Independent 23rd May)

The Queen made a surprise appearance at the Chelsea Flower Show on the 23rd May and was chauffeured around in a golf buggy to view the displays which included a special Queen's Platinum Jubilee Garden display featuring a silhouette of the Queen surrounded by 70 potted plants to represent each year of her reign. The Queen has made 50 visits to the yearly flower show in her 70 year reign.

SECURITY

Police Issue Warning for Vigilance re Vehicle Attacks During Jubilee Celebrations (Daily Mail 19th May)

The Met Police (London) have issued a warning to party organisers regarding the danger of possible terrorists attacks, advising organisers and attendees to remain vigilant with reminders terrorists using vehicles as a means of attack don't adhere to traffic management systems.

"It is recommended that street furniture is not removed... Strategically positioned vehicles can act as a deterrent, but may not completely stop an attack."


Organisers are also advised to use an air horn as a warning system:

"Any capability to quickly alert people to danger can increase their reaction time."

The police however highlight there is no specific threat to street parties over the bank holiday weekend.

EVENTS

BATON RELAY 12.

The Baton relay commences on Thursday 2nd June, spending five days in London, coinciding with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend.

The Baton will then continue on its journey visiting overseas territories such as the Falkland Islands, Jersey, Guernsey, and the Isle of Man before touring Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales. The Baton begins its journey around England in Cornwall at the Eden Project on the 4 July, the Nottingham Castle Caves on 10th July, a zip wire in the Lake District on 16th July, and will finish at Aston Hall on 28th July, the day of the Opening Ceremony for Birmingham 2022.

Wilson James' own Tom Giles will take part in the relay, running a leg in the East of England on 8th July Good Luck Tom!

Members of the public are encouraged to get involved with the celebrations and embrace the arrival of the Baton, taking the opportunity to experience the buzz of Birmingham 2022 in their community. The Birmingham 2022 website will provide information on the events and where to line the route.

QUEENS JUBILEE WEEKEND 2ND -5TH JUNE Road Closures and Travel Updates

FRIDAY 3RD OF JUNE IS EXPECTED TO BE THE **BUSIEST DAY** FOR STREET PARTIES AND CELEBRATIONS ACROSS THE UK FOLLOWED BY SATURDAY, THURSDAY THEN SUNDAY.

DAY TRIPS ARE ALSO EXPECTED TO INCREASE OVER THE COURSE OF THE WEEKEND ADDING AN EXTRA BURDEN TO THE TRANSPORT NETWORK.

DRIVERS ARE URGED TO CHECK THEIR ROUTE FOR ANY ROAD CLOSURES AND BE AWARE OF ANY OBSTRUCTIONS OR PEDESTRIANS THAT MAY BE IN THE STREET.

ROAD CLOSURES

Hundreds of road closures across the UK will be in place over the weekend to facilitate street parties and Jubilee lunches. Staff are advised to check with local media for updates and full lists of road closures in your area and allow extra time for journeys.

Drivers are warned to expect 'havoc' on UK roads over the weekend. The same amount of unofficial and impromptu parties are expected to take place as organised parties and drivers are warned of unplanned road closures that may exasperate the disruption.

LONDON UNDERGROUND

Euston and **Green Park Stations** will close all day **Friday 3rd of June** in protest against a toxic work environment affecting travel on the **Victoria**, **Jubilee** and **Piccadilly lines**.

TFL will stage a 24 hour walk-out on Monday 6th June commencing at 00:01 forcing the closure of ALL ZONE 1 STATIONS.


BUSES

Counter-Terrorism Guidance

THE FOLLOWING ADVICE IS FROM THE <u>NATIONAL</u> COUNTER TERRORIST SECURITY OFFICE

GENERAL ADVICE ACT (Action Counters Terrorism)
On identifying suspicions activity, individual, vehicle or suspect object, move away and call 999.
Or use the confidential hotline - **0800 789 321**

- Provide updated and regular threat briefings
- Maintain an effective risk assessment.
- Maintain training and engagement with ACT app.
- Easing Lockdown Vigilance Campaign Toolkit

SUSPICIOUS ITEMS CONFIRM

- · Has it been deliberately hidden
- Is it obviously suspicious
- Is it typical for this location

CLEAR

- Do not touch the item, stay away from the hazard
- Be out of sight of the item or behind hard cover
- Cordon off the area in advance of police arrival.

COMMUNICATE

- Inform your control room/supervisor
- DO NOT USE MOBILE PHONES/RADIOS within 15m

CONTROL

- Public should be stopped from entering the area
- Try to keep eyewitnesses on scene.

MARAUDING TERRORIST ATTACK

RUN

- Escape if you can
- Is there a safe route? Run, if not Hide
- Insist others leave with you,
- · Leave belongings behind.
- Do not attempt to film the incident. Run.

HIDE

- If you can see the attacker, they may be able to see you. Bullets go through glass, brick, wood and metal. You must still hide, even If you are behind a locked door.
- Be aware of your exits
- Be quiet, silence your phone
- Lock/barricade yourself in
- Move away from the door

TELL

- Call the police
- Nature of the Incident What is happening?
- Location Suspects Direction Descriptions

BOMB THREAT

- Remain calm and talk to the caller
- Note the caller's number and record the call
- Write down the exact wording and time of call
 - 1. Where exactly is the bomb right now?
 - 2. When is it going to explode?
 - 3. What does it look like?
 - 4. What does the bomb contain?
 - 5. How will it be detonated?
 - 6. who put the device in place?
 - 7. What is your name?
 - 8. What is your address?
 - 9. Do you represent a group or acting alone?
 - 10. Why have you placed the bomb?
- Note the following

The caller's

Sex / Nationality / Age

What threat language was used

Well spoken / Irrational / Incoherent

Caller's voice

Calm / Excited / Accent – note if possible

Background sounds

Street noises/House noises
