

Coronation of King Charles III

The Coronation of King Charles and Queen Consort Camilla 1.2.3.4.5.

Saturday 6th May sees the coronation of King Charles III, codename Operation Tower of London, involving the 'largest military ceremonial operation in 70 years'.

29,000 police officers have been drafted in to help police the event and 6,000 serving members of the armed forces are expected to take part in the ceremony broadcast across the globe, reaching an anticipated audience of 350 million people (277 million people watched Queen Elizabeth II's coronation across the globe in 1953).

King Charles and Queen Consort Camilla (Royal.uk 2023)

- 1. The Kings Procession from Buckingham Palace at approximately 10:20, starts the day's events, making its way to Westminster Abbey in the Gold State Coach arriving just before 11:00. It will include 200 members of the armed forces particularly from The Sovereign's Escort of The Household Cavalry Mounted Regiment.
- 2. Screening sites open from 06:00 across England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales, location details can be found here.
- **The Coronation** begins at **11:00** and is made up of five parts: The recognition, The oath, The anointing, The investiture, The enthronement and homage (including gun salutes across the UK to mark the crowning) and followed by the Queen Consort's coronation. 2,000 guests will watch the ceremony in person conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury at Westminster Abbey.
- **4. The Coronation Procession** back to Buckingham Palace commences **at 13:00**. The King, Queen and members of the Royal family are joined in the procession by approximately 4,000 members of the armed forces from across the commonwealth.
- 5. An appearance by Their Majesties on the Buckingham Palace balcony together with members of the Royal family will end the day's activities together with a 6-minute fly past involving 60+ aircrafts from the Royal Navy, British Army and Royal Air Force (including the Red Arrows).





World News

Russia Accuses Ukraine of Assassination Attempt on Putin at Kremlin (AlJazeera 3rd May)

A number of Russian news agencies report Russian authorities are accusing Ukraine of an overnight drone attack on the Kremlin on Wednesday, threatening the life of Russian President Vladimir Putin. The Kremlin denounced the attack as 'an act of terrorism' and reserved the right to retaliate stating:

"The Kremlin has assessed these actions as a planned terrorist act and an assassination attempt on the president on the eve of Victory Day, the May 9 Parade".

The President is not believed to have been injured and no damage is apparent on the building, President Putin continued with duties as normal on Thursday. Russia's claims have been refuted by Ukrainian authorities.

Man Arrested Outside Palace in Possession of a Knife (Met Police 3rd May) 1.2.

London's Metropolitan Police confirmed on Wednesday the arrest of a man on suspicion of possession of an offensive weapon, after being detained outside Buckingham Palace on Tuesday evening. 60-year-old dog breeder David Huber was observed throwing what appeared to be shotgun cartridges into Palace grounds at around 19:00 hours after his request to speak to a soldier was refused. He was detained and searched at the scene where a knife was discovered. A bag discarded at the scene believed to be owned by the suspected was destroyed in a controlled explosion as a precaution after the suspect told officers to handle it with care. The Met Police arrested the offender within five minutes and stress the suspect was not in possession of a firearm and they are not treating the incident as terror related.

<u>Cadbury Chocolate Producers Muller Recall Desserts in Listeria Scare (Independent 2nd May)</u>

Food manufacturing company Muller has announced the recall of thousands of Cadbury dessert Products from UK shelves as a precaution in a listeria contamination scare. Customers are asked not to consume the following Cadbury products with the corresponding use by dates:

Daim Chocolate Dessert - use by 18th May; Crunchie Chocolate Dessert - use by 17th May; Flake Chocolate Dessert - use by 17th May; Dairy Milk Buttons Chocolate Dessert - use by 18th May; Dairy Milk Chunks Chocolate Dessert - use by 18th May; Cadbury Heroes Chocolate Dessert (six pack) - use by 18th May.

Muller advises customers to return them to the store for a refund. Symptoms of Listeria are similar to the flu and include high temperature, muscle ache or pain, chills, feeling or being sick and diarrhoea.



Korean Student Eats USD 120,000 Italian Artist's Exhibit on Display in Seoul (Independent 2nd May)

An art exhibit entitled 'Comedian' consisting of a banana taped to a wall and displayed at a gallery in Seoul as part of an exhibition by Italian artist Maurizio Cattelan was eaten by a visiting student who claimed he consumed the work of art because he was hungry. The student taped the empty banana peel back to the wall declaring 'isn't it taped there to be eaten?'. The fruit is replaced every two or three days with a fresh piece. It isn't the first time the piece of art has been eaten, in 2019 a performance artist in Miami ate the exhibit documenting it on social media and calling it an art performance and not vandalism.

Climate Activists Target Degas' 'Little Dancer' at US National Gallery (Washington Post 27th April)

Two protestors, a man aged 54 and a woman aged 53 (both dressed in black suits) were arrested by police at the National Gallery in Washington DC last week for throwing paint on the protective casing of Degas' 'Little Dancer Aged 14'. The two protestors from Declare Emergency covered the plinth with red and black paint before moving on to the protective case declaring:

"The Earth is beautiful, and we're destroying it with climate change,"

Recent international attempts to vandalise works of art in the name of climate change protests include: Mashed potato on a Claude Monet painting in Germany and hands glued to a Botticelli in Italy and a Picasso in Australia. The case has been removed to assess the damage.

AVIATION

Cabin Crew Arrested after Discovery of Ecstasy and Ketamine in Toothpaste (Independent 30th April)

Authorities in Vietnam have arrested 65 people (including Vietnam Airlines cabin crew) after the discovery of a smuggling ring importing drugs in toothpaste tubes into the country was uncovered. When arrested cabin crew claim they were unaware the toothpaste contained illegal drugs however authorities maintain the staff were recruited by the smuggling ring together with other suspects and estimate over 50% of 327 tubes of toothpaste brought in by the crew contained drugs. In total 50kg of Ecstasy and Ketamine were discovered.

STRIKES

Thursday 4 May

Civil Service Civil Service (1 strike) - **PCS** *PCS members working in the Passport Office continue strike action in Belfast, Durham, Glasgow, Liverpool, London, Newport, Peterborough and Southport.*

Friday 12 May

Transport rail (1 strike) - **Aslef** *Train drivers represented by ASLEF begin strike action after rejecting a pay offer from the 16 train companies with whom they were in dispute.*

Saturday 13 May

Transport rail (1 strike) - **RMT** Train drivers represented by RMT stage 24-hour strike.

- Unite union staff at Heathrow to walk out
 - 4-6th May
 - 9-10th May
 - 25-27th May
- Only two carry-on bags will be allowed on board aircrafts during strike action and passengers are advised to arrive no earlier than two hours prior to departure.

LONDON TUBE ACCESS CORONATION WEEKEND

The following stations may be closed due to overcrowding and should be avoided if possible:

Charing Cross (Bakerloo and Northern lines); Embankment (District and Circle lines); Westminster (District, Circle and Jubilee lines); Green Park (Piccadilly, Victoria and Jubilee lines); Piccadilly Circus (Piccadilly and Bakerloo lines).





PROTECT DUTY

KNOW YOUR THREAT/KNOW YOUR RESPONSE

KNOW YOUR THREAT

Know how to spot suspicious behaviour, engage regularly with **PROTECTUK** where you can keep up to date on the latest training and guidance.

KNOW YOUR RESPONSE

Provide updated and regular threat briefings. Maintain an effective risk assessment. Maintain training and engagement with PROTECT UK.

MARAUDING TERRORIST ATTACK

GUIDE

- Know your evacuation routes.
 - Ensure you familiarise yourself with alternative routes should paths become blocked.
- Be able to inform and guide people with clear instructions.

SHELTER

- Know your first aid plans and RVPs.
- Lock/barricade yourself in.
- Move away from the door.

COMMUNICATE

- Know who to tell Ensure incident escalations are fully updated with correct contact details and shared appropriately.
- Location, Suspects, Directions, Descriptions.

SUSPICIOUS ITEMS

CONFIRM

- Has it been deliberately hidden.
- Is it typical for this location.
- Is it obviously suspicious.

CLEAR

- Do not touch the item, stay away from the hazard.
- Be out of sight of the item or behind hard cover.
- Cordon off the area in advance of police arrival.

COMMUNICATE

- Inform your control room/supervisor
- DO NOT USE MOBILE PHONES/RADIOS within 15m.

CONTROL

- Public should be stopped from entering the area.
- Try to keep eyewitnesses on scene.

BOMB THREAT

- Remain calm and talk to the caller
- Note the caller's number and record the call
- Write down the exact wording and time of call
- 1. Where exactly is the bomb right now?
- 2. When is it going to explode?
- 3. What does it look like?
- 4. What does the bomb contain?
- 5. How will it be detonated?
- 6. Who put the device in place?
- 7. What is your name?
- 8. What is your address?
- 9. Do you represent a group or acting alone?
- 10. Why have you placed the bomb?

Note the following:

The caller's

Sex / Nationality / Age

What threat language was used

Well-spoken / Irrational / Incoherent

Caller's voice

Calm / Excited / Accent – note if possible

Background sounds

Street noises/House noises

Protest Guidance

GENERAL ADVICE

- It is recommended you maintain a good awareness
 Inform staff that routes to work may be of your surroundings if in the vicinity of a demonstration or public gathering as some protests may escalate into violence.
- Anticipate localised travel disruption in the area of the demonstration.
- Allow additional time for journeys or arrange alternate routes to minimise potential delays.
- If in the area of a spontaneous protest, it is recommended to leave the area by the quickest means possible and seek a secure location.
- Continue to monitor media sources for updates and additions to the scheduled events.
- Consider the possibility of regular protests occurring throughout the summer as they are often not isolated events, with activists returning to the same locations time and again.

KEEPING STAFF INFORMED AND PREPARED

- impacted by protest groups.
- Keep staff updated and provide guidance on how to approach the site (e.g. consider dressing down, no identification on display on approach to site, organised travel from transport hubs).
- Morning Briefs to include lockdown measures and scenario discussion to aid confidence in SOPs.
- Escalation and Incident procedures to be brief. Allocated Team Leads to be communicated.
- Named First Aiders on site to be communicated to the rest of the team daily.

ACCESS CONTROL

- Secondary access points to be used, in order to keep main access areas clear.
- Perimeter Surveillance to be proactively undertaken.
- Reinforce security on approach to site.

PATROLS

- To identify suspicious activity in the area.
- Vary patrols by changing routes and frequency.
- Check all exterior perimeter fencing.

STAFF

- Consider increasing the number of staff on duty.
- Consider patrolling in pairs if appropriate.
- Staff access to the building may be prevented. Consideration should be given to working from another location.

SOCIAL MEDIA AND CYBER SECURITY

- Monitor social media platforms for chatter regarding protests in your vicinity.
- Further guidance to staff could be given regarding their personal cyber security to ensure no cyber-attacks via home working Wi-Fi.
